



## DUAL ENROLLMENT FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

### GENERAL CRITERIA

At least 15 years of age | Currently enrolled in 11th or 12th grade at a public or private Louisiana high school or Approved Home School | PLAN or ACT (or SAT) scores | Good standing with the high school | Permission from the high school and parent/guardian to participate | Enrolled in a college course for which dual credit (both college and high school credit) is attempted and recorded on both the student's secondary and postsecondary academic record

### THREE LEVELS OF DUAL ENROLLMENT OPPORTUNITIES

#### COLLEGE LEVEL/DEGREE COURSES

A course in an academic subject that generates postsecondary institutional credit and appears as a General Education course on the current Board of Regents' Master Course Articulation Matrix (transferable courses only).

**Eligibility:** Student must be on track for completing the Louisiana Core 4 Curriculum and graduating with a high school diploma. Must have a PLAN or an ACT Composite score of at least 18; **AND** English sub-score of at least 18 or have successfully completed the developmental course required for placement into the college level degree credit English course; **OR** Mathematics sub-score of at least 19 or have successfully completed the developmental course required for placement into the college level degree credit mathematics course.

#### TECHNICAL COURSES

A course in a skill or occupational training area that contributes to a declared Career Area of Concentration and leads to a recognized industry based certification. (Graduation Pathway).

**Eligibility:** Student must be on track to graduate from high school (having earned at least 11 Carnegie hours if a junior or 16 if a senior) & have declared a Career Area of Concentration.

Must have a PLAN Composite score of at least 14 **OR** ACT Composite score of at least 15.

#### DEVELOPMENTAL COURSES

An English or mathematics course that generates postsecondary institutional credit, but not degree credit, and is designed to prepare the student for college-level instruction.

**Eligibility:** Student must be a 12th grader/senior on track to graduate with high school diploma. Must have a PLAN Composite score of at least 14 **OR** ACT Composite score of at least 15.

Sub-Score Mathematics 17

Sub-Score Mathematics 18 to 19
