Adjunct NCCER Industrial Maintenance Electrical & Instrumentation Instructor

- Attend and provide meaningful instruction for all module sessions. Be punctual in class attendance and provide instruction for the complete class period. Make appropriate arrangements for necessary absences according to College policies.
- Develop, distribute, and post to Canvas or other Online course management system as approved by project manager the course syllabi that are in accordance with approved master syllabi and which describe in detail the requirements of the module, attendance policy, assessment strategies, grading system, classroom policies, and other information as appropriate.
- Maintain accurate attendance, progress, and evaluation records in an acceptable grade book format and file these grade books (photocopies/print-outs) with the project manager at the end of each module.
- Adhere to all time lines established, particularly with respect to the submission of grade rosters, reporting non-attendance of students, referring students for counseling, withdrawing students from classes for excessive absences, and responding to records inquiries and other communications about students in a timely manner.
- Provide classroom instruction in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act, College harassment policies, and/or other legal requirements.
- Keep minimum office hours.

Qualifications: A Bachelor's degree in related discipline (Master's preferred) from a regionally accredited college or university. Teaching experience at the college level or high school level preferred. Candidates must have good instructional techniques; computer knowledge; student-centered attitude; and be well organized. Must have excellent verbal and written communications skills in English; other languages is a plus. Previous work experience required in: electrical generation; offshore systems and earthing; installation and calibration of SMART transmitters; and Distributed Control Systems DCS. Minimum of 5 years oil and gas experience with offshore experience preferred, and certified, or qualified, to teach NCCER Industrial Maintenance Electrical and Instrumentation subject matter.

To become a certified NCCER instructor one must meet the following qualifications:

- Experience at a minimum journey or technician level in their area of expertise. (A journeymen/technician level craft person is someone who, based on industry accepted criteria, typically has 4-5 years documented working experience (2000 hours per year) that may or may not include industry credentials depending on the craft and industry requirements.) OR
- A minimum of three years' experience as a certified teacher in a vocational/technical construction or maintenance-related training program
- A Master Trainer may also serve as an instructor if they meet the above criteria and submit Form 101 and the ICTP information sheet
